As Chair of the Board of Directors, it is my pleasure to share the Betty Brinn Children's Museum's 2024 Annual Report.

In 2024, we intentionally invested our time into reshaping how we tell our story, sharing not just what we do, but why we do it. Through a new brand campaign and enhanced donor communication, we reconnected with long standing supporters and proudly welcomed new ones, all while sharing a new vision for how our Museum can help shape brighter futures for all children.

Several moments stood out this year. We were honored to host our community at two stewardship events: *Party on the Patio* in July and *Gathering of Gratitude* in November, to thank those who have helped bring our mission to life. We also welcomed local and state elected officials to the Museum, giving them a firsthand look at the powerful learning through play that happens here, signifying the value of early childhood education.

2024 also marked the debut of one of our newest exhibits, *Hot Lava*, the introduction of a series of reimagined and new special events, and a mission-aligned gift shop to further enhance the guest experience.

As we look ahead, we're excited to grow our impact through expanded educational offerings and enhanced play-based experiences. On behalf of all of us at Betty Brinn Children's Museum, thank you for investing in our mission.

This past year, we have deepened our commitment to what we know matters most: providing children with safe, joyful spaces to learn and grow through play. At Betty Brinn Children's Museum, play isn't just fun – it's essential. Research confirms what we see every day: when children engage in play-based learning, they build essential skills in creativity, problem-solving, critical thinking, physical coordination, and social-emotional development.

We know that 90% of brain development happens before the age of five. That's why our mission is so important in reaching children during these crucial and transformative years. As the only children's museum in Greater Milwaukee, we are uniquely positioned to offer hands-on, technology-free opportunities for unstructured, screen-free play that encourage curiosity, creativity, and exploration in all areas of development. Thanks to your generous support, we welcomed nearly 170,000 individuals to the Museum in 2024, 33% of whom participated in subsidized attendance programs.

At the same time, we recognize that not all children have equal access to early learning opportunities. The Museum is committed to being a place where all families feel welcome, and in 2024, we were proud to serve a record number of visitors through our Special Admissions Fund, which helps ensure more children can benefit from the power of play.

Thank you for believing in our mission and supporting our community's littlest learners. You are helping to shape the next generation - one playful moment at a time.


2024 Financial Summary

Revenue



Contributions Breakdown



Highlights of 2024















Hot Lava Grand Opening

Our newest exhibit, *Hot Lava*, takes young explorers on a volcanic adventure where they can design their own lava course using pretend rocks, planks, and wood tiles. This exhibit promotes movement and balance, safe risk-taking, gross and fine motor skills, and encourages teamwork, problem-solving, and collaboration. This exhibit was made possible thanks to the generosity of Debra Altshul-Stark and Brian Stark.

Betty Brinn Children's Museum's Birthday Celebration

In both July and November, we welcomed supporters and community partners to join us for an evening of stewardship, gratitude and networking. During the events, we highlighted exciting updates at the Museum and recognized our community for their ongoing support.

Outdoor Balcony Refresh

Our exhibits team transformed our outdoor balcony spaces, introducing an outdoor paint wall, greenhouse, and interactive sound garden where kids can explore their creativity, sensory development, and self-expression.

Betty BOO's Spooktacular

Children and families enjoyed a not-so-scary Halloween celebration with special guest artists, glow-in-the-dark slime, and of course, costumes and trick-or-treating!

Cocoa & Claus

We introduced our newest special event: Cocoa & Claus, where children enjoyed an exclusive story time with the big guy himself – Santa Claus!

New Year's Eve at Noon

Children and families enjoyed a beach-themed New Year's celebration at our most popular annual event! At this sold-out celebration, kids joined for a beach ball dance bash and ball drop, along with DIY noisemakers, face painting, and ocean-themed special programming. The event highlighted Milwaukee's own DJ Shawna and was generously sponsored by JP Morgan.

Gift Shop

We closed the year by opening our new Gift Shop to enhance our visitor experience. Families can purchase toys, books, stuffed animals, and educational activities that align with our Museum's exhibits and programming and promote early childhood learning.

Our 2024 Impact

Visitors & Attendance

Nearly 170,000

total visitors engaged in hands-on, unstructured, play-based learning.

4,571

member families enjoyed unlimited annual admission.

1,802

visitors attended sold-out special events, including Bedtime at Betty Brinn, Betty BOO's Spooktacular, Cocoa & Claus, and New Year's Eve at Noon.

of our visitors came from Wisconsin, representing 47 counties, demonstrating broad statewide impact.

Special Admissions Fund

33%

of guests served by the Museum were supported by our Special Admissions Fund, an increase from 25% in 2023. 10,134

individuals received free admission to the Museum during Community Access Days, thanks to support from Northwestern Mutual. 1,354

families received a discounted annual pass through an Access Membership. 13,275

individuals received discounted daily admission through Museums for All, a 15% increase from 2023.

Field Trips & Curriculum-Based Programs

More than 13,000 students and adults visited the Museum and received educational programming.

More than 16,600 individuals received STEAM-focused programming within 87 local community events through our Wonder Wagon, nearly tripling its impact from 2023.

242 schools, daycares, summer camps, and organizations serving individuals with specific needs attended field trips at the Museum.

50% of field trips were free or reduced-priced for schools serving those with limited incomes, an increase from 44% in 2023.

Community Partnerships



We partnered with nearly **50 local community organizations** to offer educational programming and resources and discounted admission to our families.



We donated nearly **200 family memberships** to support local nonprofit organizations and schools in their fundraising efforts.
